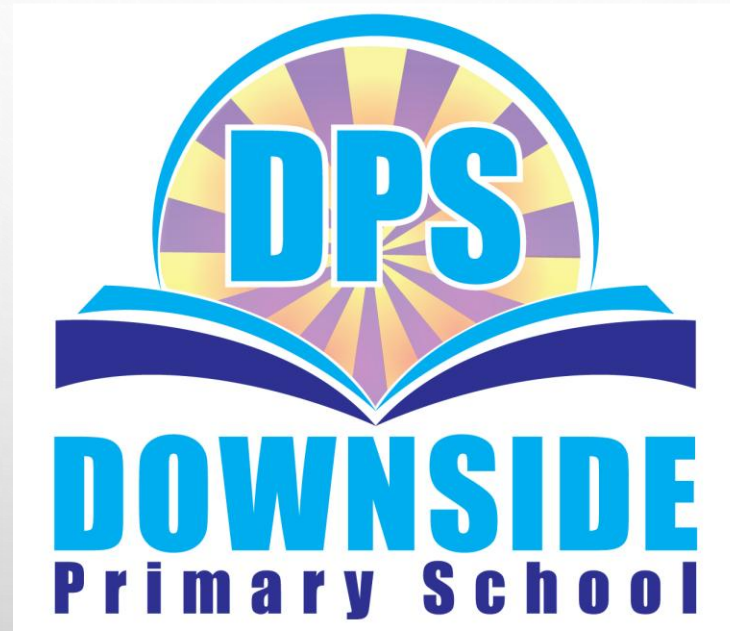

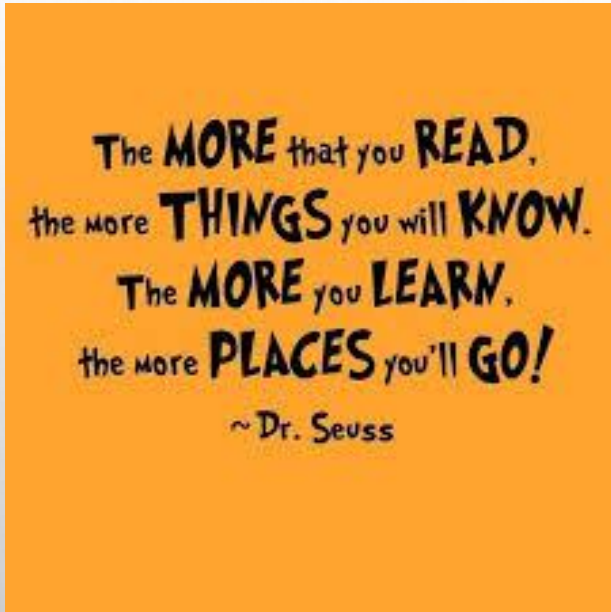

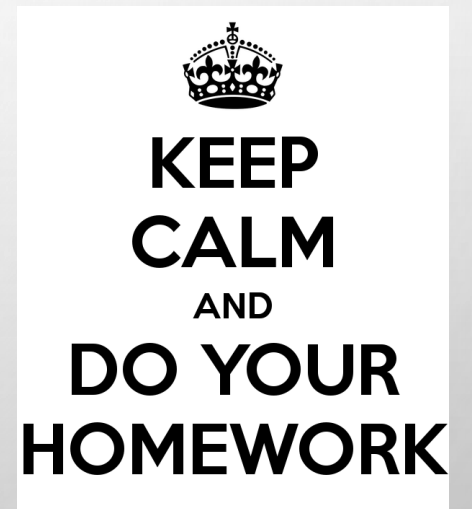

Reading Challenge

- Children are encouraged to read at home with parents.
- Every time a child reads at home and the adult signs their reading journal they will get a stamp.
- When a child has a certain amount of stamps they will receive a prize.

Homework:

- Set once a week
- Handed out on Wednesday and collected in the following Monday.
- Will focus on learning over the school week (sometimes research based)
- Homework will focus on a variety of subjects.



KS1 Phonics screening check:

Towards the end of Year 1 all children will sit the phonics screening check with their class teacher.

It is an assessment of your child's phonic decoding skills.

It consists of 20 real words and 20 pseudo words that your child will read aloud to their teacher.

We will do a considerable amount of preparation at school through daily phonics lessons, individual and guided reading sessions and weekly interventions.

You can help your child to prepare by reading frequently at home with them.
