
PE days are:

The curriculum:



This half term we will be studying the author Julia Donaldson and her books. We will be reading 'The Gruffalo' and 'The Gruffalo's Child'. As part of our learning, we are going to be finding out more about the characters, light and dark and woodland animals and their habitats.

We have organised a trip to Wendover woods in May, to support our learning about the Gruffalo and woodlands; more details will follow shortly.

After February half term, we will continue to focus on Julia Donaldson and shall read texts including the 'Smartest Giant' and 'Stickman.'

Home Learning

Throughout the term we will continue to send weekly phonic and learning log activities home for the children to complete. We appreciate your support with this as these activities reinforce much of the learning taking place in class.

We are committed to encouraging a love of reading so will continue to send reading and library books home for you to share with your child. Please remember to write in your child's reading record to tell us about progress made at home.
