<p align="center">Art and DT</p> <p>Draw or paint a picture of a natural disaster. It could be a landscape scene or an action scene.</p> 	<p align="center">Fun Writing</p> <p>Film or write a news report to explain what has happened during the disaster. Remember to include the features of journalistic writing that we have learned at school.</p> 	<p align="center">Science</p> <p>Design a shelter to help people to survive a natural disaster. Draw and label the shelter with the features that you would include. Which materials would you use and why? You could even build your shelter if you are feeling adventurous!</p>	<p align="center">Games / PSHE/ Numeracy</p> <p>List some countries that offer the most assistance to countries that experience natural disasters and some ways in which they help.</p>
<p>Build a 3D model of a volcano. You could use Papier-mâché and even paint the model. When presenting it to the class you could explain each part of the volcano and how it works.</p> 	<p>Write a poem inspired by a disaster. This could be a description of the disaster scene, or it could be about somebody who has been affected by the disaster. Think about the type of poem that you are going to write. Remember that it doesn't have to rhyme.</p>	<p>Describe what would occur during earthquakes of different levels of severity in your home.</p>	<p>Create a board game inspired by the topic 'Natural Disasters'.</p>
<p>Make a model of the Earth's layers.</p>	<p>Make a glossary Explain the meaning of technical language that you have used. For example, you could explain what 'dormant' means and 'active' in relation to volcanoes.</p>	<p>Create a detailed map. This could take the form of a weather report or it could be a map to explain where a historical disaster occurred. You could show where volcanoes are located in the world or where earthquakes are most common.</p> 	<p>Create a graph to show the number of people killed by major volcanic eruptions around the world.</p>
