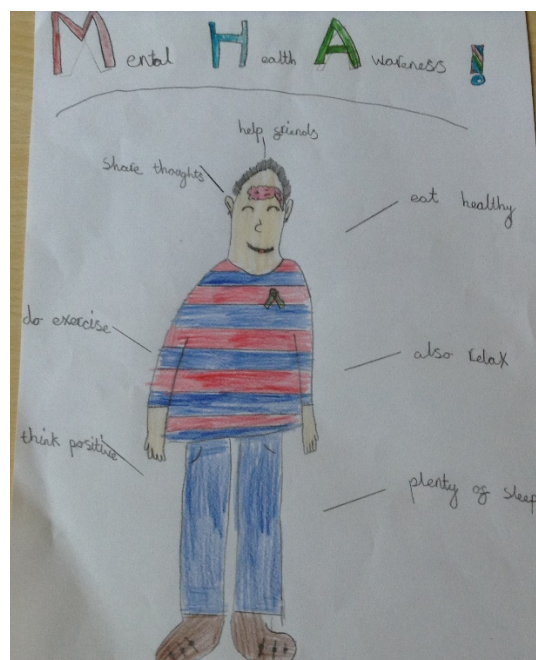
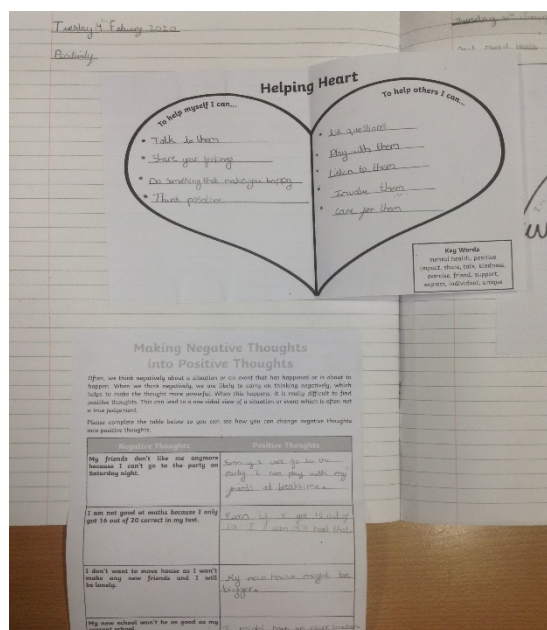


Week ending: 7.2.20


