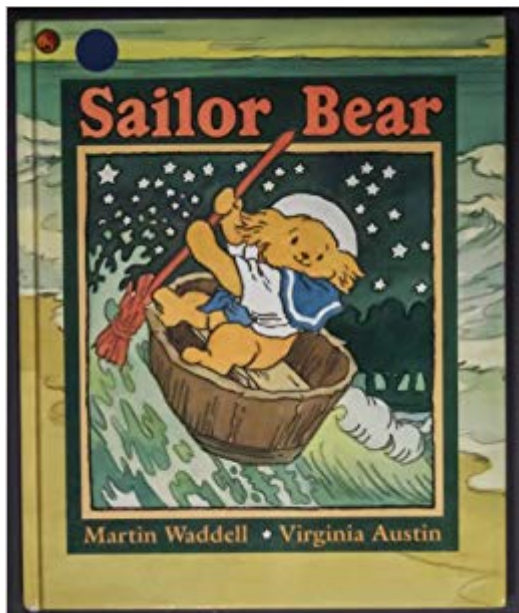


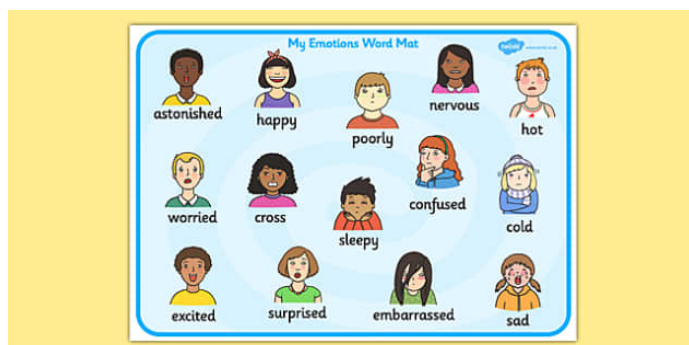
Week ending 18.09.20

What would the next sentence be?

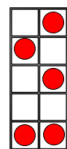
We have also been using the following vocabulary to compare two amounts; 'equal to', 'more', 'less', 'greater than', 'fewer', 'less than', most and least.
