Year 3 have had a great start to the Summer term. As last term, we are working really hard to improve class attendance percentages. Please continue to support us with this.

In Geography lessons this half term children will be learning more about Luton. This time, they will use the knowledge they have to compare Luton to a famous city in Brazil (Rio). They will continue to work on map skills and broaden their use of geographical language. We will also learn a little bit about how carnival is celebrated in both of these locations.

In Literacy, we are back to fictional writing. The children have been working really hard and have planned some Portal stories. Over the next two weeks, we will be working on writing these using a range of descriptive language. I am really looking forward to reading some of these.

In Numeracy, the children are coming to the end of a unit of work on Fractions. This week we have looked at how to add and subtract fractions.

Here are the objectives we have worked on in this unit:

Count up and down in tenths; recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts and in dividing one-digit numbers or quantities by 10

Recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators

Recognise and use fractions as numbers: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators

Recognise and show, using diagrams, equivalent fractions with small denominators

Add and subtract fractions with the same denominator within one whole (e.g. $5/7 + 1/7 = 6/7$)

Compare and order unit fractions, and fractions with the same denominators

Solve problems that involve all of the above
